

MAIN TYPES OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES PRESENTED IN THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL ATLAS OF BOHEMIA

TYPE	EXPLANATION
area of military activities	field fortification, battlefield (Late Middle Ages to the 20 th cent.)
barrow cemetery	group of burial mounds (prehistory and Early Middle Ages)
castle	fortified complex of buildings of residential, representative and military functions (High and Late Middle Ages)
hillfort	large fortified (enclosed) area, potentially of various functions (prehistory to Early Middle Ages)
mining area	stone quarry, gold panning site, area of mining of various minerals
museum	museum, open-air museum, archaeological park, centre of experimental archaeology
old tracks	local or long-distance track, mostly hollow way (Middle Ages to Modern)
production area	area of specialized production (e.g. glassworks)
residential area	area used mainly for living and household activities, can be enclosed or fortified
ritual place	place of cult and ritual; since Early Middle Ages mainly a church, chapel, monastery, etc.
